



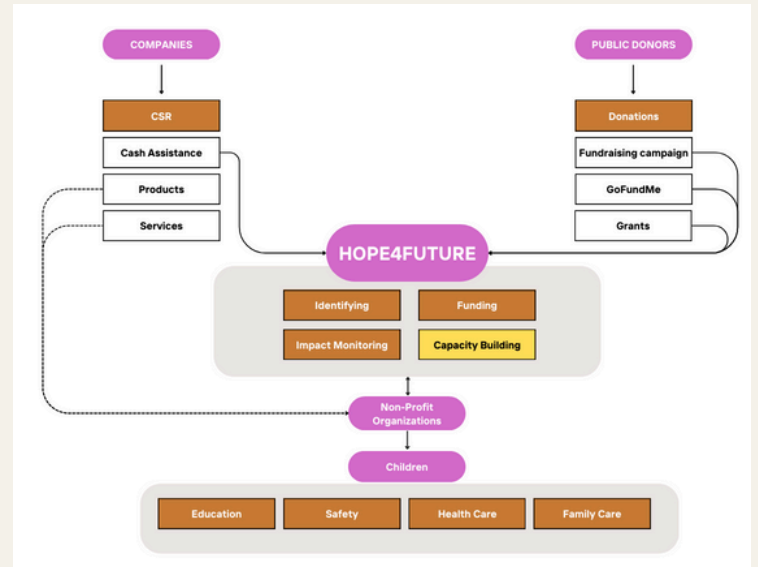

Millions of children in Indonesia—especially those living in remote islands—still lack access to education, healthcare, safety, and family care. Local heroes like NGOs, teachers, and volunteers are working tirelessly, but they often lack the resources, visibility, and connections needed to sustain their impact. This is why our work matters: Hope4Future bridges this gap by channeling support directly to children through the caretakers who know their needs best.

HOW WE WORK

- **Identify and prepare local partners:**
We work with trusted CSOs and grassroots groups that support children across Indonesia.
- **Connect with donors and companies:**
We link these local heroes to organizations and individuals who want to create real, measurable impact.
- **Ensure transparency and accountability:**
Every contribution is carefully monitored and reported, so resources go exactly where they're needed most.
- **Directly improve children's lives:**
Our model ensures support reaches the children through the caretakers who know them best.



PILOT PROJECT: ARU ISLANDS



We are launching a **community-powered model for balita (children under five years old) health and early development in Kepulauan Aru**, a remote island district in Eastern Indonesia located approximately 2,500 km from Jakarta, with a total population of around 111,500 people. Balita make up roughly 6% of the population (~7,000 children), **highlighting a critical need for early interventions.**

How You Can Help Transform Aru Community

- **Government & Health:** Enable access, engage communities, and co-deliver programs.
- **Universities & NGOs:** Recruit and mentor volunteers, support balita programs on the ground.
- **Companies & Donors:** Provide funding, in-kind supplies, and logistical support.

What You Will Gain:

Make a **real difference in children's lives**, receive **quarterly impact reports and stories from the field**, and help **create a replicable model for remote communities.**

Our approach is **rapid, participatory, and locally driven:**

- **Mobilize local change actors:** University students and Posyandu volunteers serve as on-the-ground facilitators for balita health and development support.
- **Partner with health authorities:** Collaboration with Puskesmas and the District Health Office ensures technical guidance and accurate data.
- **Participatory needs assessment through two Posyandu:** By working with two local Posyandu, where balita usually come for regular check-ups, we identify their most pressing health, nutrition, and early development needs.
- **Iterative interventions:** Based on assessment findings, we implement targeted initiatives (health kits, nutrition and hygiene education, and early learning support) and distribute them through the Posyandu, refining interventions for maximum impact.

Focusing on balita ensures that this pilot **builds a strong foundation for long-term health and learning outcomes in one of Indonesia's most remote regions.**
